The liberation of Broekhuizen. List of men killed.

The liberation of Broekhuizen was a black and particularly sad day for the 3rd Battalion of the Monmouthshire Regiment: a total of 31 men were killed, among them 10 officers and 3 NCO's. Add to this the soldiers who were killed prior to the attack, and the balance is 43 killed and over 140 wounded.

The exact figure of the losses on German side is unknown: estimates range from 17 to 60.

Boekhuizen did not forget its liberators. On 26th October 1994 - nearly fifty years later - a monument was dedicated in the village centre to honour those who gave their lives so that others might live in peace.
